- Continuation of a range of commissioned programs and services for adult and youth delivering interventions that include group programs, support people with AOD and co-occurring Mental Health presentations, assertive outreach, counselling, peer support, support for families and carers and workforce development
- Specialist assessment and treatment for people and families affected by pharmaceutical misuse or dependence and integrated

into community health services

- Screening physical health needs and connecting consumers with their general practitioner and other professionals as part of their care team to address and monitor physical health and wellbeing
- Incorporation of AOD as a dual diagnosis into the EMPHN mental health stepped care model.
- Youth AOD outreach services targeting at needs areas screening, assessment and brief interventions, assertive outreach, and support for young people, families and carers

organisations or embedded within culturally safe teams.

- Access to services through both mainstream and community driven culturally-safe environments.
- Other activities as identified through needs assessments or stakeholder input.

Further objectives of AOD Core sub-activities include:

- Close collaboration with State funded AOD intake services, GP practices, community-based AOD agencies and other groups, such as the Eastern Mental Health Service Coordination Alliance and North Eastern Mental Health Service Coordination Alliance)
- Capacity building, supporting health education, recreation and brief interventions, pro-social group-based activities, assertive outreach, and support for families and carers
- Program redesign aims to identify opportunities to better integrate AOD and mental health services in the EMPHN catchment.
